1 Corinthians 13: 1 (NASB)

If I speak with the tongues of mankind and of angels, but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.

1 Corinthians 13: 2 (NASB)

If I have the gift of prophecy and know all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.



Just as cutting the hair from Samson took away the power of the Gift God had given him, removing love strips us of the Power of our Gifts God has given us!

Paul now goes even deeper!

1 Corinthians 13: 3 (NASB)

And if I give away all my possessions to charity, and if I surrender my body so that I may glory, but do not have love, it does me no good.



What does it mean to surrender your body?

1 Corinthians 13: 3 (NASB)

If I gave everything I have to the poor and even sacrificed my body, I could boast about it; but if I didn't love others, I would have gained nothing.



So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. 1John 4: 16



What does the phrase "Love is Patient" mean to you?


Patient

Greek: akrothumeó Compound word from makros and thumos Definition: to persevere, to be patient

The literal sense of the term is "extending a long time"



Greek: chrēsteuetai


Definition: kind, full of service to others, gentle




John 13: 1-5 (NIV)






Was Judas there?

After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.






When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them.


Why is showing Kindness sometimes hard to do?

Love is patient, love is kind, it <u>is</u> not jealous; love does not brag, it is not arrogant.




Jealousy

Where does jealousy originate?




James 3: 15 (NLT)




Can jealousy and Love exist together?

Bragging

Greek: perpereúomai (from per peros, "a braggart")

Definition: to brag, to show off, one who needs too much attention


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
Arrogant

Greek: *physióō* (from *physa*, "air-bellows")

Definition: inflate by blowing; swelled up, an egotistical person spuing out arrogant ("puffed-up") thoughts.

Where is the heart of an arrogant person focused?





Greek: aschémoneó (as-kay-mon-eh'-o)

Definition: to act unbecomingly, to act rudely, to act improperly, to dishonor.





Greek: paroxunó (par-ox-oo'-no)


Definition: to arouse anger, to provoke, to irritate.
