

Brahma

The Creator

Vehicle: Swan

has 4 heads, 4 arms, and a reddish complexion; not commonly worshipped; not to be confused with Brahman (the ground of all being) or the Brahmin (priestly caste)

Saraswati

Goddess of Knowledge, Music, and the Arts

Vehicle: Swan

wife of Brahma; sits on a white lotus playing a veena



Vishnu

The Preserver

Vehicle: Garuda (bird)

has 4 arms, a blueish complexion, and rests on a snake; was incarnated (born as an animal or human) nine times with one more still to come; is the main god of Vaishnavism

Lakshmi

Goddess of Wealth and Prosperity

Vehicle: Owl

wife of Vishnu usually shown bestowing coins and flanked by elephants





Shiva

The Destroyer / Transformer

Vehicle: Bull

has matted hair, a third eye, a blue throat and a trident in his hand; often worshipped in the featureless lingam form; is the main god of Saivism

Parvati

The Divine Mother

Vehicle: Lion

the reincarnation of Shiva's first wife; has many forms, such as the popular Durga and Kali (see below); often shown together with Saraswati and Lakshmi as the tridevi ('triple goddess')




Islam

- 1.3 billion followers
- Worship a single god but do not know his name or what he looks like.

Christianity

 There is only one God that is a Holy Trinity of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.

Sources of Knowledge of God

The source of all knowledge about God comes from God himself and this can be divided into two areas: natural revelation (creation) and special revelation by the Holy Spirit (primarily for us God's words recorded in the Bible and in the incarnation of Jesus Christ).

Natural Revelation

Most hummingbirds cross the Gulf, typically leaving at dusk for a nonstop flight of up to 500 miles, which takes 18-22 hours depending on the weather and they do not "hitchhike" on other birds.

Before departing, each bird will have nearly doubled its weight, from about 3.25 grams to over 6 grams; when it reaches the U.S. Gulf coast, it may weigh only 2.5 grams.



There is no advantage to this migration. They have plenty food in South America, the weather is perfect.

Natural Revelation


Romans 1: 18-20


Natural Revelation

This is the book of the generations of Adam. In the day when God created man, He made him in the likeness of God. He created them male and female, and He blessed them and named them Man in the day when they were created.



Special Revelation

God spoke to man verbally, through signs, dreams, visions and manifestations of God in the Old Testament

Hebrews 1:1

Verse 1-In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways

Special Revelation

God speaks to us through Jesus Christ

Hebrews 1: 2

Verse 2-but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe.

Special Revelation

God speaks to us through His Word and the Holy Spirit

2 Timothy 3: 16-17

God the Father revealed by the Logos (= Word) who is the Son Jesus Christ

John 1: 1-2

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.

John 1: 14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

How do we explain the following scriptures?
