Hebraic Jews

Hebraic Jews were traditionalists that had always lived in the land of the patriarchs and spoke Hebrew (the language their tathers spoke). They also lived near the temple and requiarly worshiped there.

Hellenistic Jews Lived outside of the Jewish homeland. They had adopted the language and culture of the Greeks. They were often looked down on as inferior and treated as outsiders by Hebraic Jews.

What was the complaint and who made it?

Who does it mean that the Apostles were waiting on tables and how does that relate to the complaint?

Strong's Concordance

trapeza: a table, dining table

Original Word: τράπεζα, ης, ἡ

Part of Speech: Noun, Feminine

Transliteration: trapeza

Phonetic Spelling: (trap'-ed-zah)

Definition: a table, dining table

Usage: a table, (a) for food or banqueting, (b) for money-changing or business.

In other words...

"It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God to manage the Tinances and daily operations of the Church"

The Church had grown 50 large that the Apostles were unable to use their spiritual qifts because they were busy managing the day to day operations of the Church!

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding.

Act 6: 4 NIV

Act 6: 6 NIV

This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism.

Note the names!

All seven are Greek, All are FEIENISTIC JEWS!

What does this demonstrate?

The fact that the Church didn't choose three Hebraic Jews and Three Hellenistic Jews demonstrates their desire for complete unity!

Since the HEIENISTIC JEWS Test overlooked they put Hellenistic Jews in charge of the program.

Act 6:7 NIV

They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.
